For 3 or More

400 Sets of Clues
on 200 Cards,
5 Scoring Tokens

Object

Score the most points by solving the most clues.

Set Up

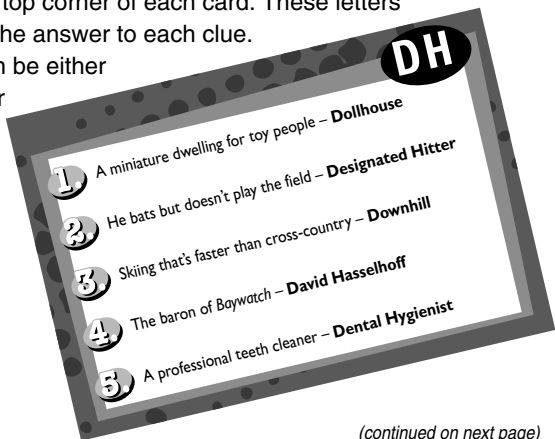
Place the cards near the playing area. You'll notice that the scoring tokens have different point values printed on one side (2, 4, or 6). Scramble them and place them number-side down in the center where everybody can reach them. Get a pencil and paper to keep score.

Players try to solve a set of 5 clues. A letter combination is found at the top corner of each card. These letters are hints in the answer to each clue.

Answers can be either two words or

compound words. For example, here are the clues and answers for the letter combination DH:

Play

- Players take turns being the reader. If you're the reader, take a card and read aloud the letter combination in the top right corner. Then, read the clues in order from 1 to 5.
- All other players play at the same time and try to be first to shout out the correct answer to each clue.
- The first player to shout the correct answer takes any one of the scoring tokens from the center of the table.
- If at any time the players are stumped, you as the reader may opt to pass and move on to the next clue.
- As the reader, you have the final say on who got the correct answer first. If you decide that two players have tied, you turn over a chip, and each of the tying players get half that point value added to their score.
- If more than two players have tied, none of the tied players score.

Scoring

After all five clues have been read and answered (or passed), record the scores on a piece of paper. Players score the total of the point values from the scoring tokens they won during the round.

Scramble the scoring tokens and return them face down to the center of the playing area. The player to the left of the first reader takes a new card and becomes the reader for the next round.

Winning

If you're first to reach 50 points when everybody has had an equal number of turns being the reader, you win!
